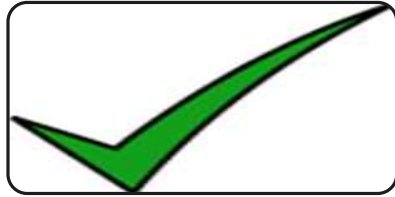

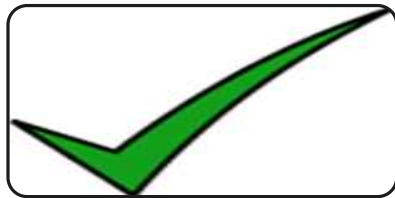

# DIVERSION DIVISION

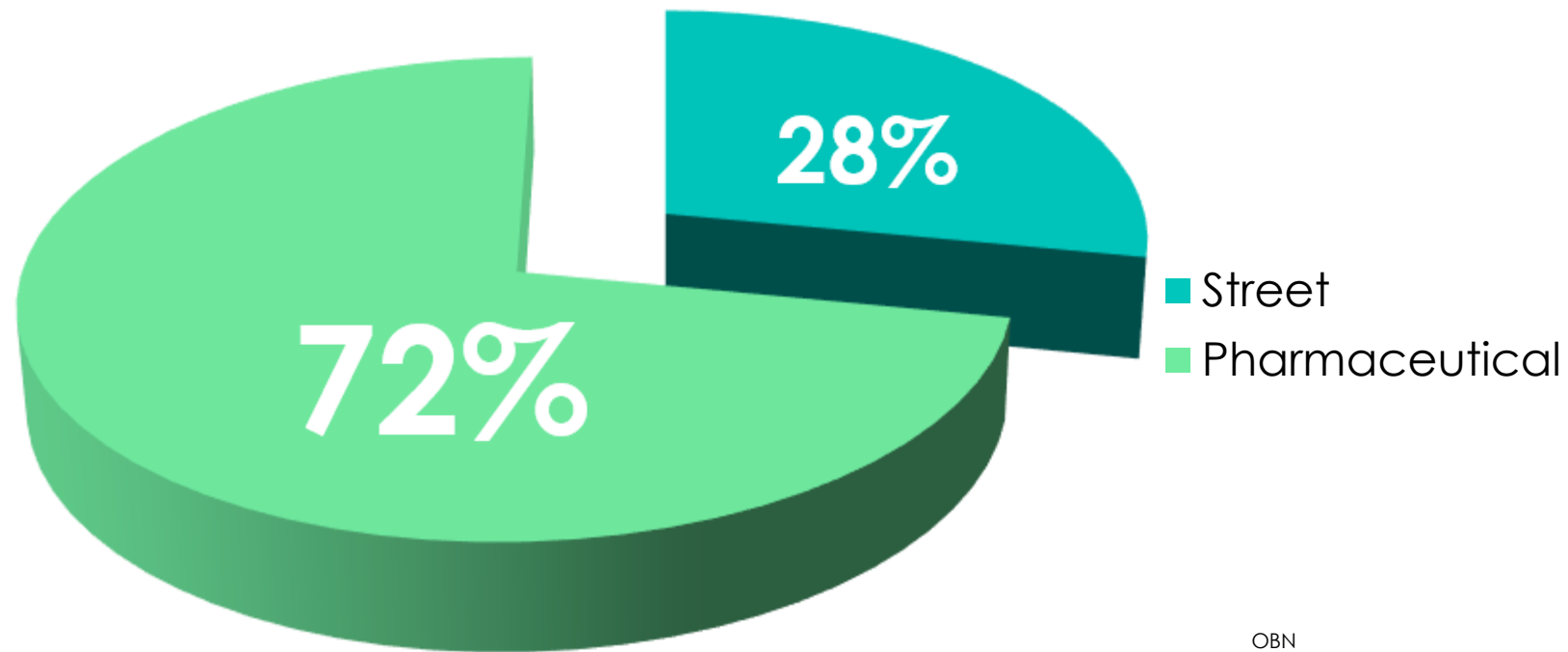


- OBN Diversion oversees **more than 19,000** doctors, pharmacists, and hospital prescription licenses.
- OBN Diversion investigates allegations of prescription fraud a.k.a. “Doctor Shopping”, Forgeries and other forms of prescription diversion.
- OBN Diversion maintains the **nation's only Real-Time Prescription Monitoring Program** (PMP) that began on July 1, 2006. PMP provides registrants and professional board investigators with direct computer access to a database that tracks and maintains controlled prescription information.

Pharmaceutical deaths: there are at least one prescription drug or over the counter drug involved



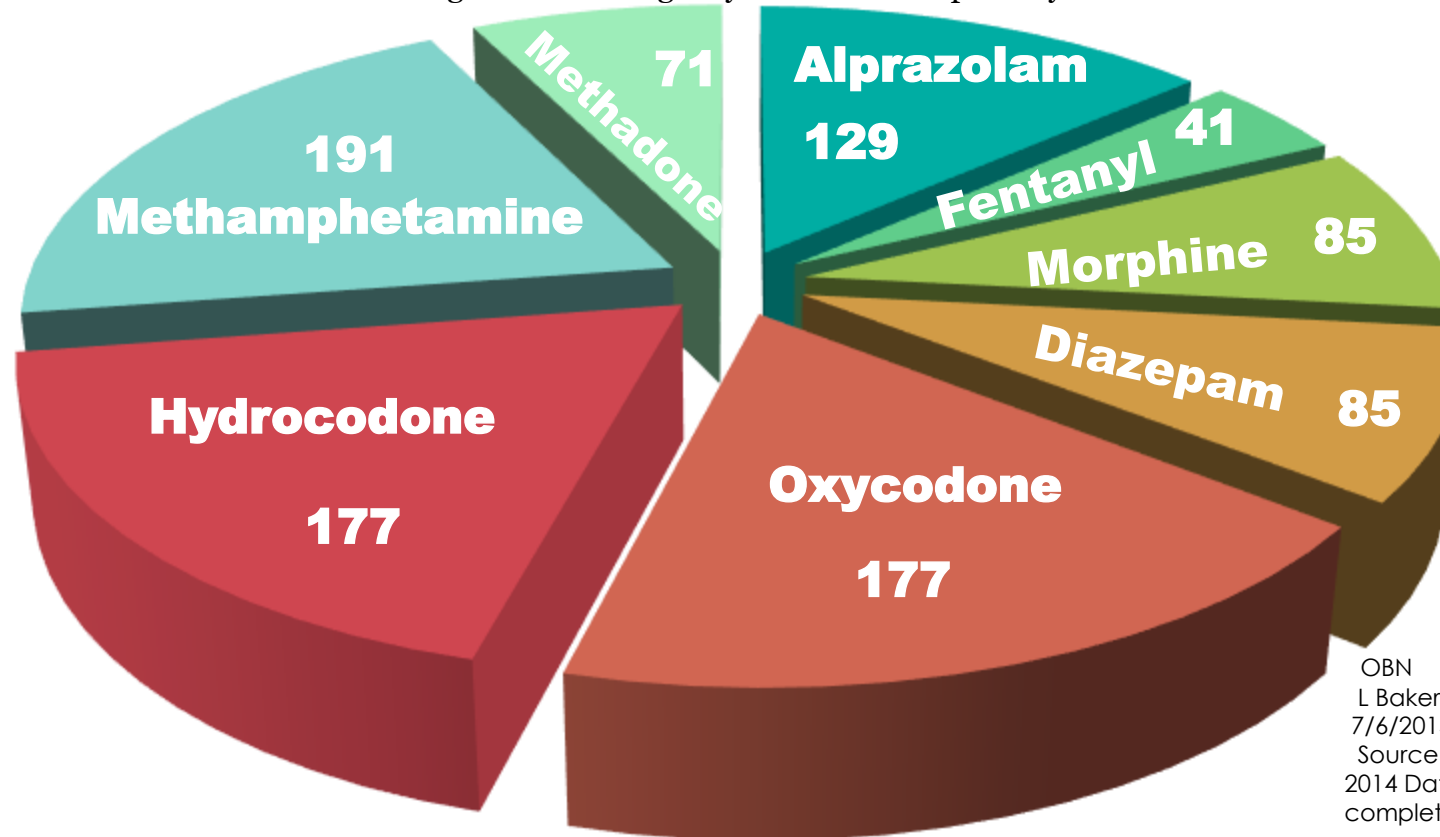

## 2014 DRUG OVERDOSE DEATHS INVOLVING THE TOP 8 ABUSED DRUGS

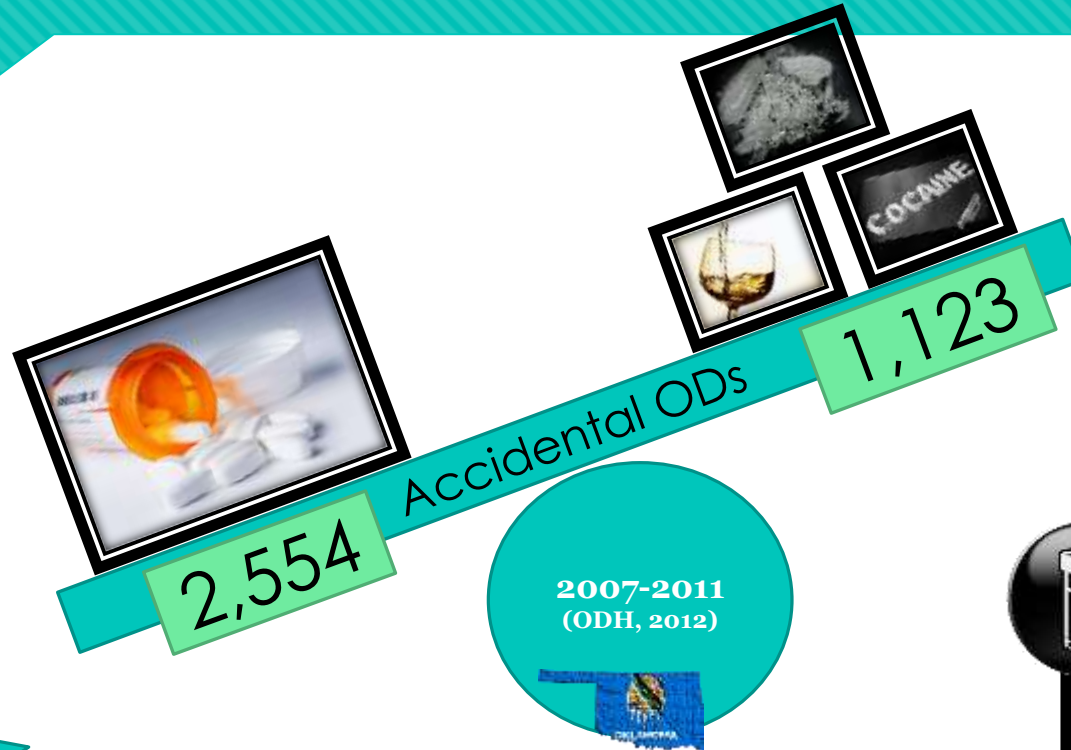

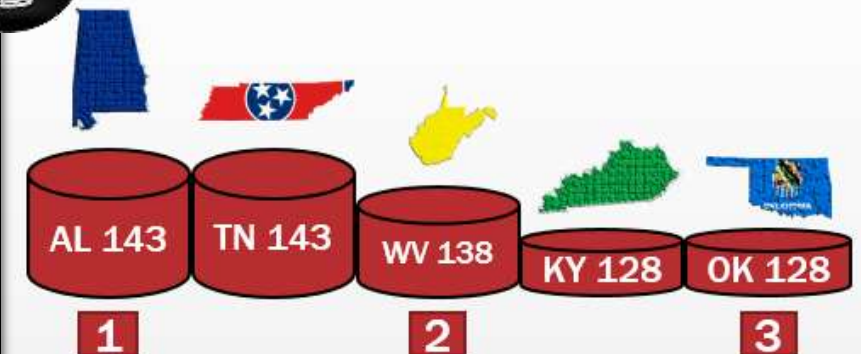

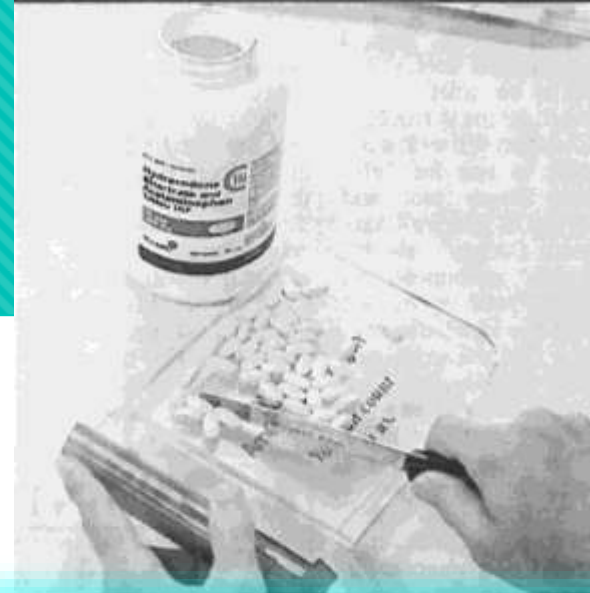

#### HOW OKLAHOMA RANKS IN PAINKILLER ABUSE, OVERDOSES

Deaths from drug overdoses, particularly prescription painkillers, increased significantly over a decade, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported. In 2008, 36,450 people died of drug overdoses — a national rate of nearly 12 per 100,000 people. Nationally, almost 5 percent of Americans 12 and older reported abusing painkillers in the past year.

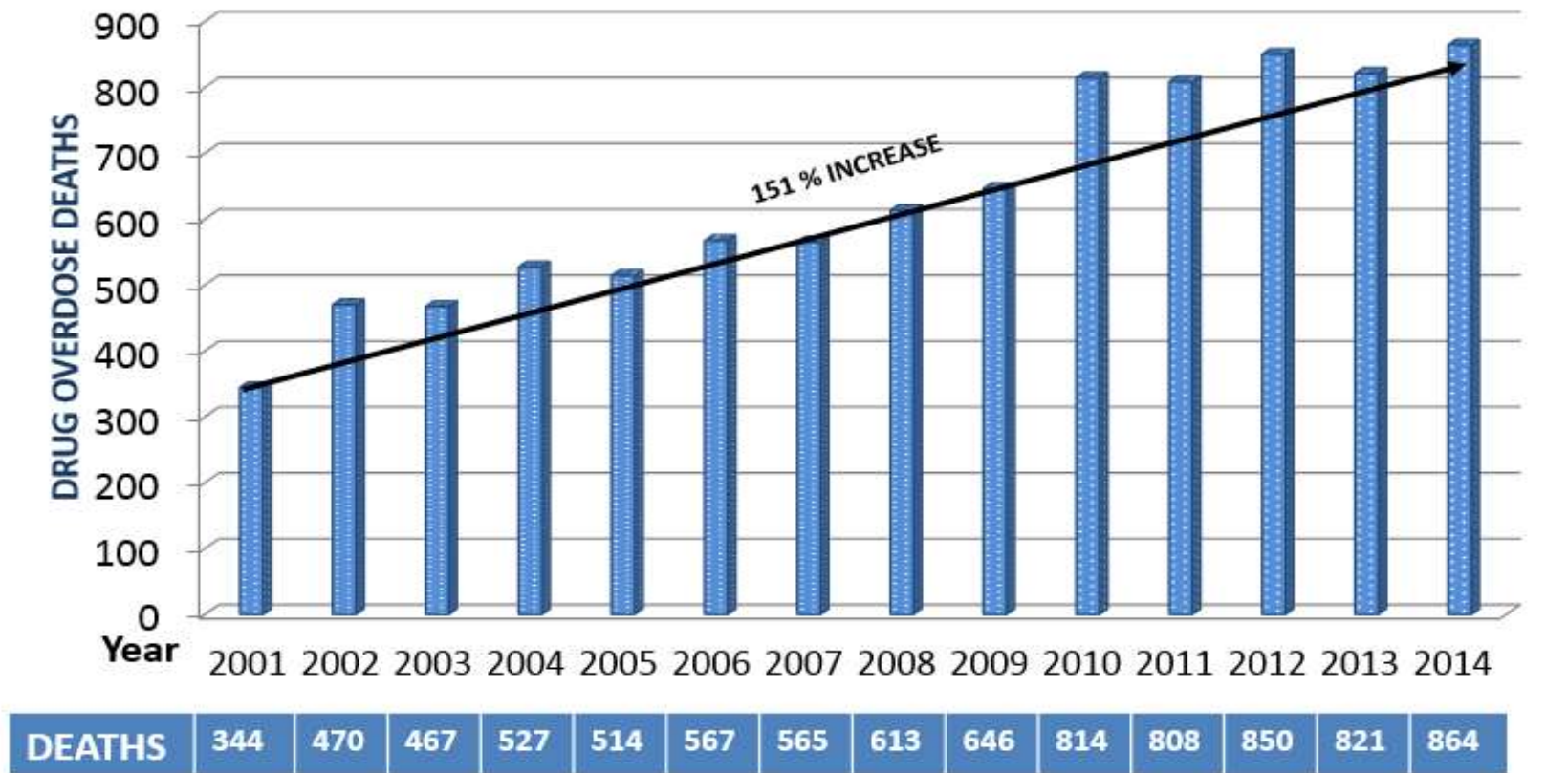

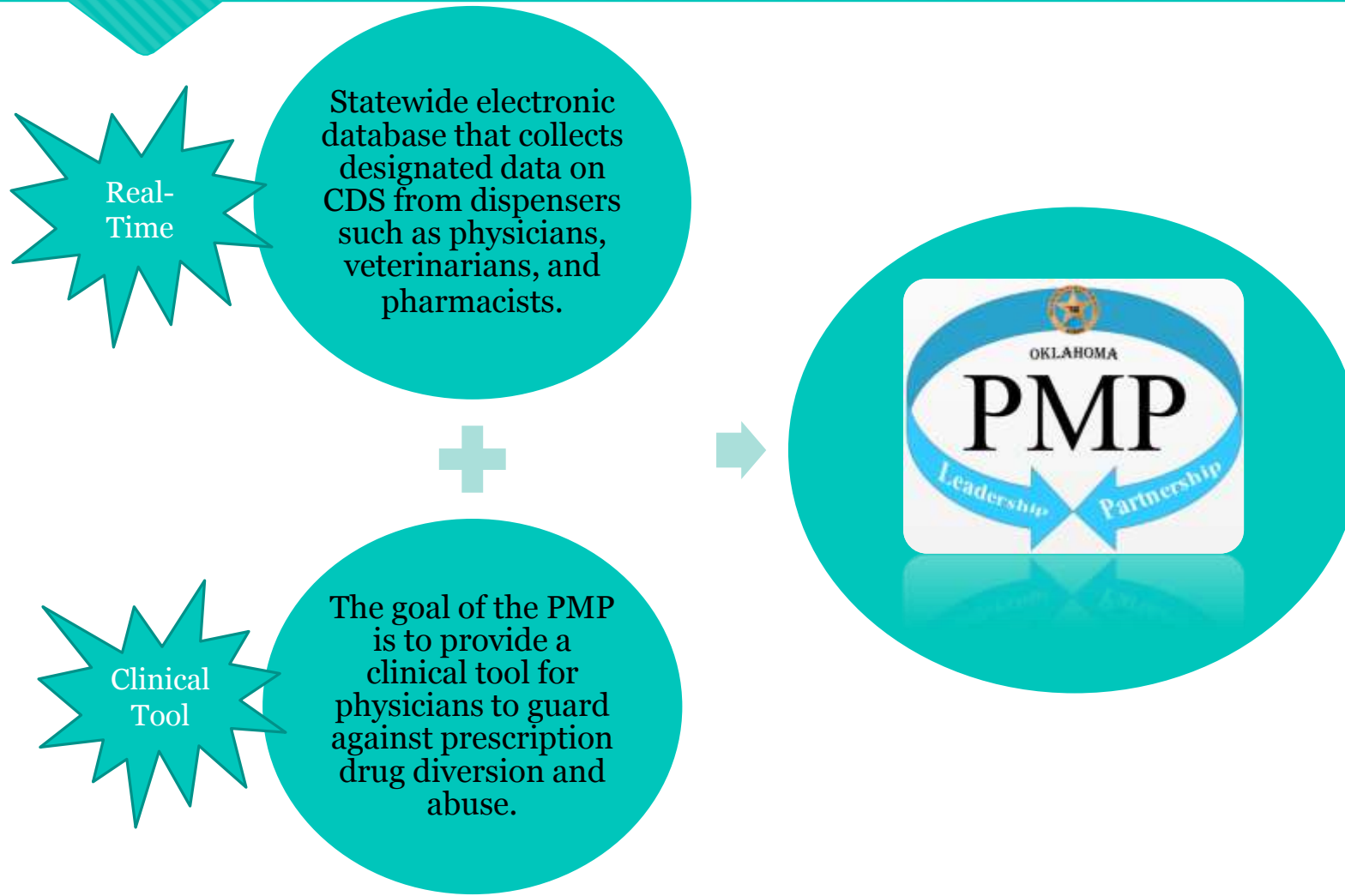

# Remember...

**Run a report on your prescribing or dispensing activity.**

**Patient reports can be ran for any date or length of time from January 2010 forward.**

**Prescriber and pharmacy reports can be ran for a maximum of 12 months at a time for any period from 2010 to 2014.**

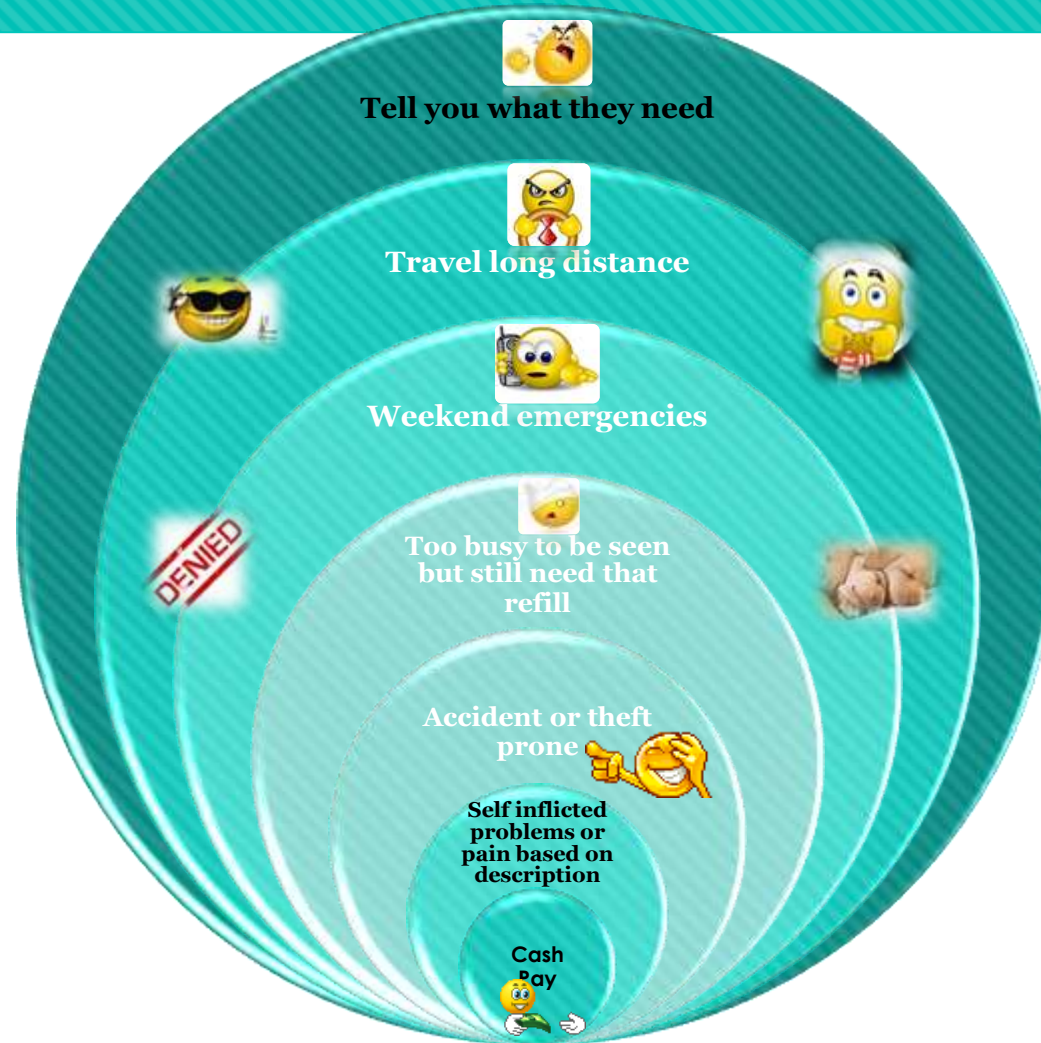
**PAs & APRNs will have their own PMP account  
RNs can only have a sub-account if a physician entrusts them one.**

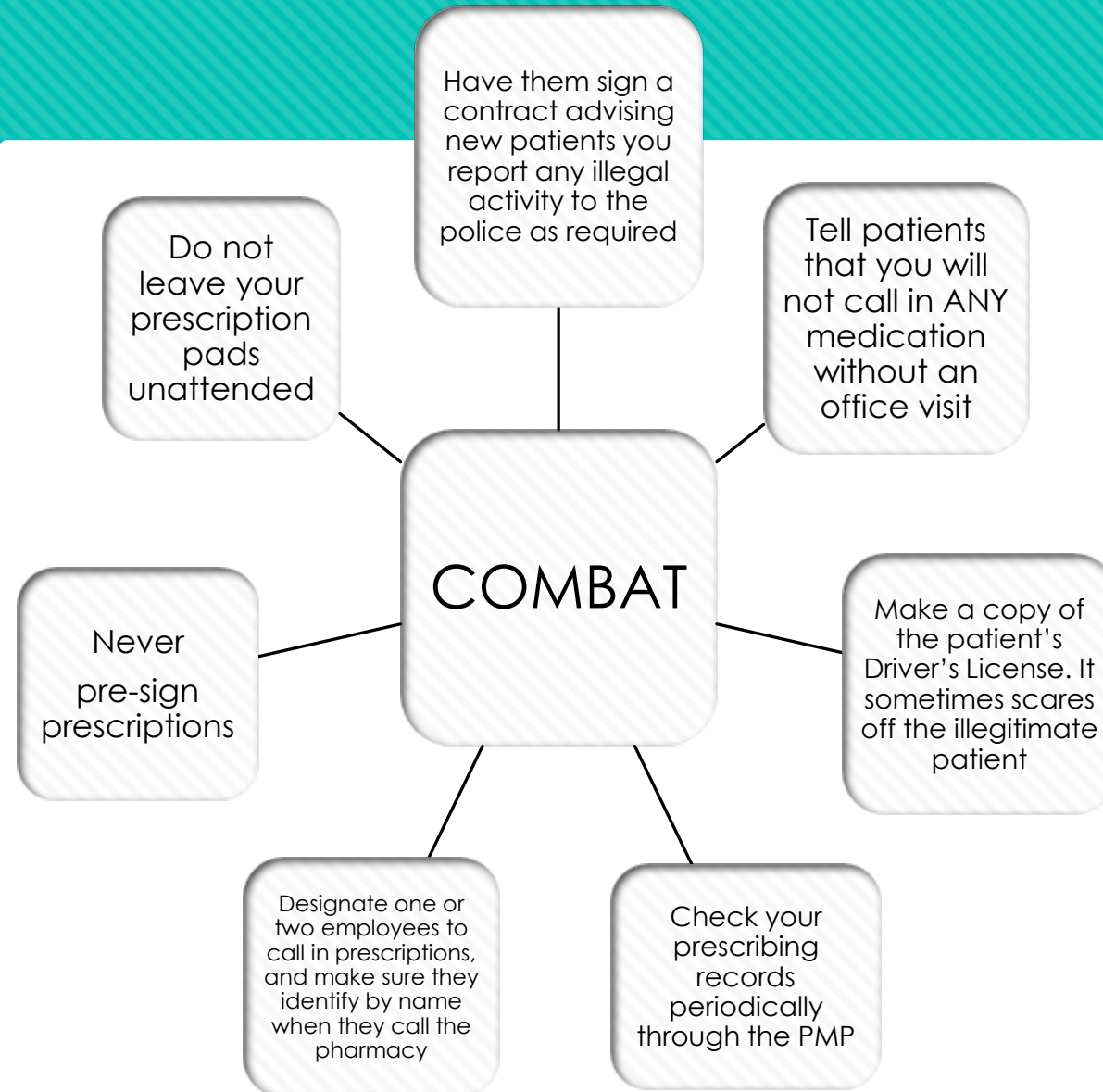

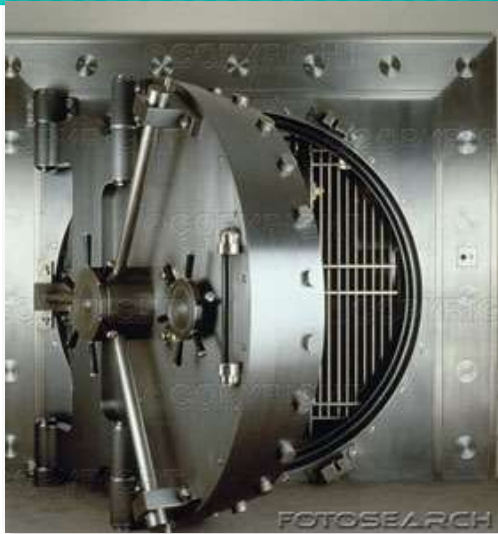

# IT IS THE LAW



## OAC 475

(OBN Rules & Regulations)

20-1-2 (a): All applicants and registrants shall **provide effective controls and procedures to guard against theft and diversion of controlled dangerous substances.**

20-1-8 (b): All registrants shall notify the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control or the local law enforcement agency having jurisdiction of any information the registrant receives concerning any violations of the Oklahoma Controlled Dangerous Substances Act and/or federal statutes and regulations related to controlled dangerous substances.

## HB 1948

**Effective November 1<sup>st</sup>**

- ❖ Mandatory checks: new patients and every 180 days (6 months)
- ❖ Three categories: opiates (including synthetic and semisynthetic), benzodiazepines, and carisoprodol
- ❖ PMP reports are now part of the medical records

## Oklahoma Statutes - Title 63

§ 2-304 A: A registration of this title, to manufacture, distribute, dispense, prescribe, administer or use for scientific purposes a CDS shall be **limited, conditioned, denied, suspended or revoked** by the Director upon a finding that the registrant:

- (4) Has failed to maintain effective controls against the diversion of controlled dangerous substances to unauthorized persons or entities;



# HB 1948 Changes Effective November 1<sup>st</sup> 2015



- ✓ Mandatory checks for every new patient and every 180 days (6 months) for three categories of drugs: “opiates, benzodiazepines, and carisoprodol” (HB 1948)
- ✓ Copies of PMP reports can be kept in a patient’s file
- ✓ Delegate accounts allowed
- ✓ Note in the patient’s file that the PMP has been checked
- ✓ The patient’s history may be disclosed to the patient at the physician’s discretion
- ✓ “Any unauthorized disclosure of any information collected at the central repository is a misdemeanor” (HB 1948)
- ✓ Access to the PMP is for “the purpose of patient treatment and for determination in prescribing or screening new patients” (HB 1948)
- ✓ “The duty to access and check shall not alter or otherwise amend appropriate medical standards of care”
- ✓ Exceptions: nursing facilities and hospice
- ✓ OBN does NOT assess any administrative fines. “Licensing boards shall have exclusive jurisdiction to take action against a licensee for a violation”

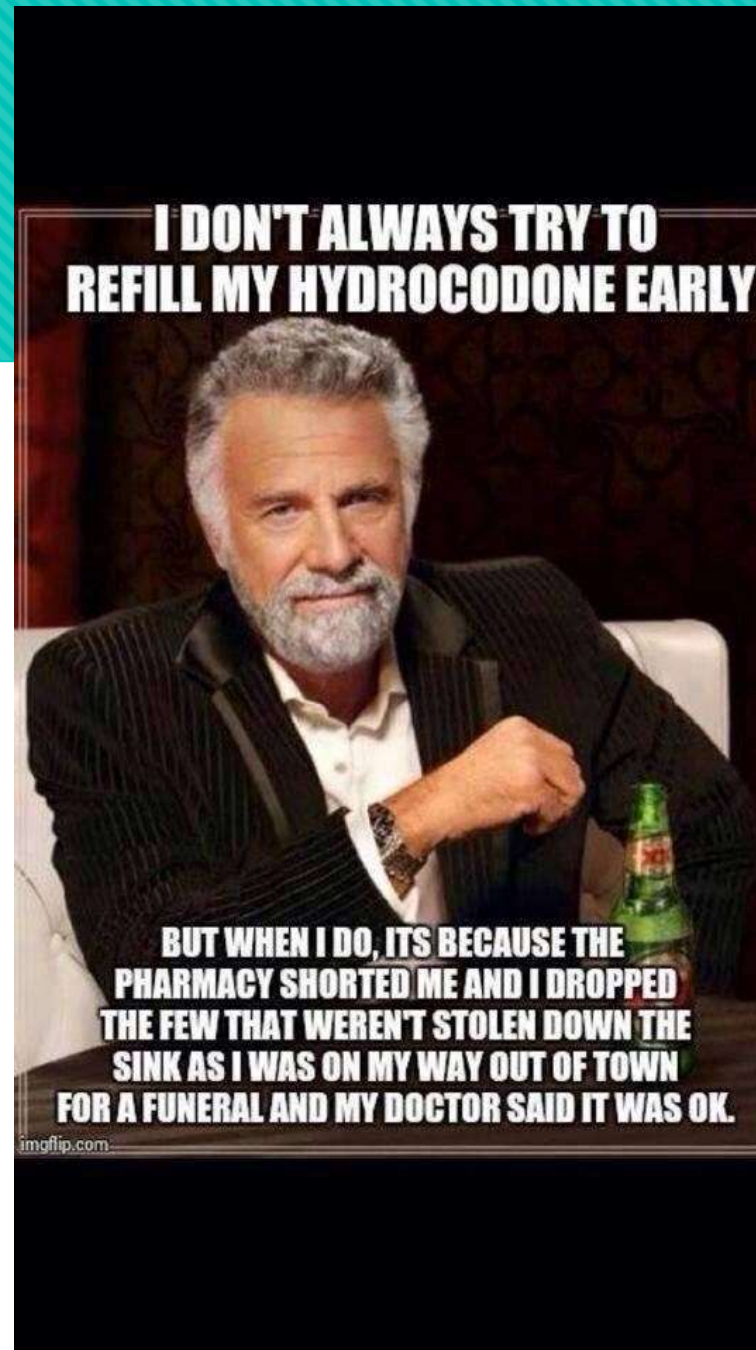

## DON'Ts


- ✓ Do NOT keep a PMP report in a patient's medical records/file (changing starting Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> )
- ✓ Do NOT hand out a copy of the PMP report to the patient (physician's discretion)
- ✓ Do NOT give out copies of reports to law enforcement or attorneys
- ✓ Do NOT run reports for other doctors, law enforcement, or anyone else
- ✓ Only run reports on active patients

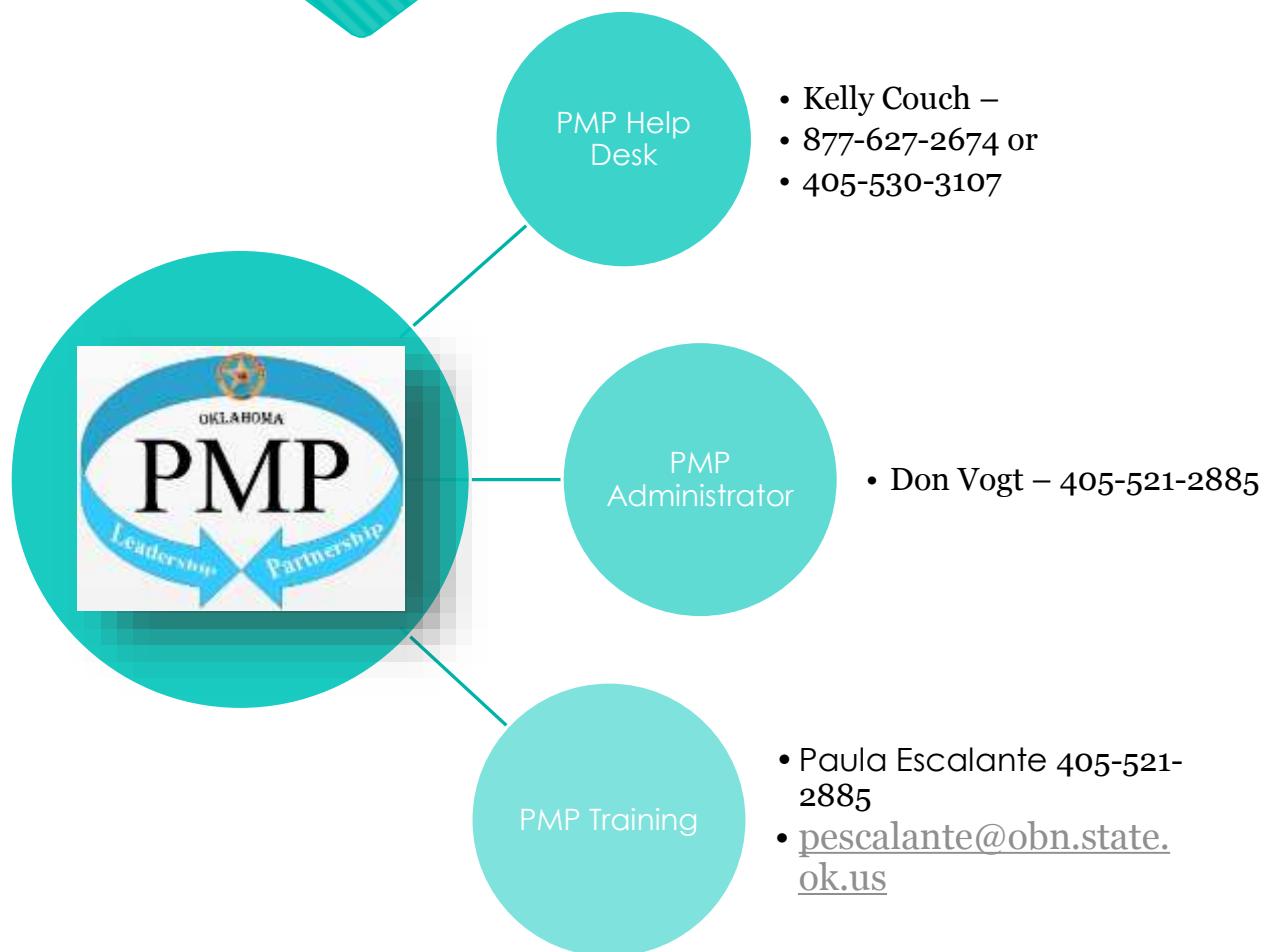
